Stage 3 Canberra Excursion

Students from our school have recently undertaken an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy.

Our students learnt about civics and citizenship in the classroom and saw their knowledge brought to life when they visited Parliament House, the Museum of Australian Democracy and the National Electoral Education Centre at Old Parliament House, and the Australian War Memorial, as well as a number of other sites of cultural and historical interest,

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion, the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards these costs. The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
