Parliament Speeches

Although only 14 of these students will fill formal positions as part of the Front Bench, each one should be so proud of their commitment of the vision of our school – a place where everyone has the right to feel safe, learn and participate equally. Parent Focus Groups

I would like to thank the parents who attended and gave feedback to Mr Steve Galbraith as part of our whole school evaluation for 2016. Your understanding and insight into our school, along with suggestions for the future have been invaluable. I would also like to thank the four parents who gave us feedback through the Tell Them From Me Survey last term. These thoughts and ideas allow us to plan more effectively from a community perspective. I also invite any other parents, carers or community members to email me directly with any additional comments or feedback you would like known about Barrack Heights Public School. Also, our next P&C meeting on the 30th November will provide a forum for any parent or carer who would like to make comment. Please come and have your say or clarify your understanding of our school's aims and strategic directions moving into the future.

School canteen

Whilst 2016 has not brought us any closer to finding a new canteen operator, I would like to thank the staff for their voluntary assistance in providing both breakfast and lunch to students each day. Our sponsor, the Denny Foundation, has continued to assist us with bread and fruit donations. These are used throughout the school each day. We still provide the \$2 lunch service, which includes a sandwich, piece of fruit and bottle of water. I would also like to commend the Parliamentary Canteen Committee, who continue to sell ice-creams and ice-blocks at lunch and recess to raise money for additional playground equipment in our school. The new cars and other toys have been well received!

Behaviour and suspension procedures

During the last few weeks, there has been a decline in the behaviour of some students, leading to withdrawal of these students from mainstream learning and social aspects at school. The school executive and I will always work with students displaying negative behaviour choices - providing time for reflection, understanding other choices that could have been made and resolution of the issue. Many times, Mrs Broomham or myself will make contact with parents or carers to explain what has occurred at school, and to ask for support in resolving the negative behaviour.

If the negative action or behaviour of the student compromises the safety of themselves, other students or staff within our school, the student may be considered for suspension from the school. Suspension allows the staff involved with the student to create a plan that may include a Risk Assessment, Behaviour Management Plan, Individual Learning Plan or combination of these to re-engage the student and reduce the chance of the negative behaviour reoccurring. *Suspension is not a punishment,* and will not be utilised as such at this school. If you have any concerns regarding your child's behaviour, please contact the school.

Parent support for our school

Once again, I would ask ALL parents who pick up and drop off their children outside our school to assist us in taking care of your children's safety. We have again had several near misses, with parents unwilling to drive or park in a safe manner. It is unacceptable that several staff members have been verbally abused by parents while trying to keep our kids safe. You cannot pick your child up from the middle of the road, whilst on the pedestrian crossing, illegally parked or in our driveway.

In addition to this, can I remind parents and carers that all students continue with their learning until 3pm. If you are waiting for your children, please be mindful of the noise of conversations around the hall, as it can be a distraction.

End of year events and excursions

This week, we begin the "end of year run" of events and excursions. Please keep on top of any payments or permission notes that your child requires to participate in these activities. Thursday, Year 6 will participate in DOSH Day (High School Transition) here at the school. On Friday, we have Year 6 and some Year 5 students visiting Wollongong University. 40 other students are participating in the "Get Hooked with Fishing" workshop down at Lake Illawarra, Windang. Next week, all students in Years 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 will walk to Warilla pool each day to attend the Special Swimming Scheme. Only students wilth permission to swim will get into the water, all other students will watch from the side of the pool. Please ensure that your child has returned their note and \$10 or \$20 per family (max). If payment is a problem, please contact Ms Rudling at the school.
